NRMC Program Profile

Transportation

The transportation program at NRMC began in 1994 as the result of a federal grant to improve access to healthcare. Since that time, thousands of people have benefited. NRMC continues to fund this program as a service to the community. The program has two wheelchair accessible vans that can hold up to ten people or two wheelchairs and six people. A caregiver can be transported with the patient if so desired.

Patients are transported to any service of Nevada Regional Medical Center or to any physician on the hospital's active medical staff. The program currently serves patients in Vernon, Bates, Barton and Cedar counties. Requests for transportation are taken on a first-come, first-serve basis; however, all attempts are made to provide the requested transportation. The staff works closely with various hospital departments to accommodate each patient's needs.

The program is operated as a joint collaboration between NRMC and OATS, Inc. OATS, Inc. provides the drivers, training, van maintenance, insurance and licensing for the vans. NRMC provides the routing, scheduling, dispatching, statistical reports and clerical support for the program. The vans run from 7 a.m.- 4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday.
